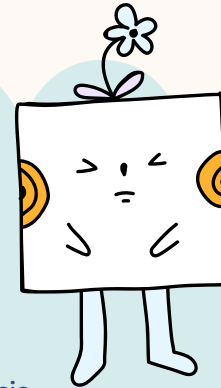
April 2 was declared Autism Awareness Day to contribute to the cause.

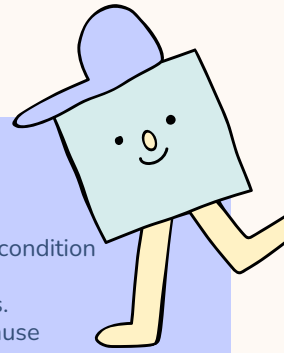

Autism is a neurodevelopmental condition with genetic and environmental factors. Parenting does not cause autism.

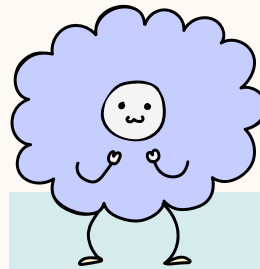


Each person with autism faces different challenges.
